What inspired you to go into design?

I come from a family of artists who supported and encouraged my interests in fine art and design. I am inspired by color, form and texture and have always enjoyed creating compositions. Interior design seemed liked the perfect way to apply my artistic interests in an art-related career.

## How do you describe your own personal style?

Although I take pride in versatility, the fusion of the past and the present has become my signature style. I approach interior design artistically and think about balance and composition when making selections. This aesthetic sensitivity translates into a sophisticated classic design with a contemporary edge. My approach to design is conceptual, developing creative ideas from an intellectual thought process. I am influenced by my experiences, by different cultures and from my own aesthetic sensibilities. My interiors reflect an ethereal, coastal feel with urban sophistication highlighting artistic creativity and conceptual design. There is a strong focus on duality between soft, textured, organic elements and hard, clean-lined architectural

materials. Geometric shapes are not only symbolic references but emphasize balance and repetition. My work exemplifies yin and yang, a unique combination of hard and soft, contemporary and classic, urban and coastal with an Eastern influence and Western gesthetics.

# What was your inspiration for the "Yin Room" Master Suite that was unveiled at the 2009 Designer Showcase?

My inspiration comes from nature and my constant quest for balance in my life and work. My initial vision was derived from silver capiz shells I found on the beach. The aesthetic concept grew from there. The intellectual concept came from my deep appreciation for Eastern culture and philosophy. One day, while practicing a special Yin-Chi Kung breathing technique on the beach, I admired the peaceful light of the harvest moon setting over the Gulf. My teacher explained that Yin is femininity, soft and restful and symbolized by the moon. Yin is also defined as a shady place, characterized as slow, insubstantial. diffused, cold and tranquil. This described perfectly the aesthetics and meaning behind the "Yin Room".



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
