Marco's Kira Krumm reaps more design accolades

Marco interior designer Kira Krumm continues to reap professional accolades.

Krumm said she sought balance and harmony, and thus "approached the backgrounds in neutral, (introducing) color and texture only in accents."

She said, too, that an aim was not to distract from the Gulf views.

She is a member of the Marco Island City Arts Advisory Committee; the Marco Island Chamber of Commerce; the United Arts Council; the Collier Building Industry Association, and the National Association of Home Builders.

She is the former vice president and visual arts chairman for the Marco Island Foundation for the Arts, and acted as the chairman of the Selection Committee for Art Quest, the first public sculpture exhibition on Marco.
